We invite applications from scholars with excellent research and teaching records. The professorship will conduct internationally competitive research on the molecular mechanisms underlying the positive effects of exercise and training on health and disease caused by physiological adaptation. This should be demonstrated by publications in high-ranking international journals, successful third-party funding, and a clearly recognizable scientific profile.

Active collaboration in the development of the new Faculty of Life Sciences: Food, Nutrition & Health is expected. This also includes the establishment of new scientific and interdisciplinary B.Sc. / M.Sc. programmes such as the master's programme Global Food, Nutrition & Health and the bachelor's programme Food & Health Sciences. We would like to find a university lecturer who, due to his / her research orientation, offers links to the faculty's economic, legal, or social science research groups in the field of public health. Other possible links are the focus area Food & Health Sciences or subject areas from the University of Bayreuth's other departments, in particular Sport Science.

The ability to teach in English is a prerequisite for employment, as significant parts of the teaching programme of the new faculty are offered in English; international applicants must be willing and able to teach in German, at least in the mid-term.
